According to the [WHO/UNICEF Joint Monitoring Programme for Water Supply, Sanitation and Hygiene \(WASH\)](#), 45% of healthcare facilities in Least Developed Countries (LDC) lack basic water services and 21% have no sanitation services. It also found that over 600 million children around the world lack basic drinking water and sanitation services at their school.
